Concealed Weapon Permit Classes



We had a total of 18 participate in the two classes: seven KFRW members and four non-members on Saturday, April 6th, and seven members on Sunday, April 28th.

This was a fundraiser for our club's student Essay Contest, raising \$620. We also gained three new club members due to the class!

The class, provided by the J.C. Sheriff's department, Sheriff Mac McNeill, Sgt. Marvin Edwards, MSgt. Chris Eades, and Captain Gerald Knecht our instructors, is the first step to applying for a Florida Concealed Weapon or Firearm License from the Dept. of Agriculture and Consumer Services. Total cost is \$97.

2016 ELECTORAL EXPLANATION

Why the Founders saw the importance of the Electoral College...

There are 3,141 counties in the United States.

Trump won 3,084 of them. Clinton won 57.

There are 62 counties in New York State.

Trump won 46 of them. Clinton won 16.

Clinton won the popular vote by approximately 1.5 million votes.

In the five counties that encompass NYC, (Bronx, Brooklyn, Manhattan, Richmond & Queens) Clinton received well over 2 million more votes than Trump. **Clinton only won four of these counties**, **Trump won Richmond**. Therefore these five counties alone, more than accounted for Clinton winning the popular vote of the entire country. *These five counties comprise 319 square miles*.

The United States is comprised of 3,797,000 square miles.
