KFRW Community Outreach and Educational Opportunities

Our club took advantage of the Black Friday sale at WallBuilders and purchased resources to use for educational purposes in the community (like Bill Snyder did with the Constitution Alive series), at schools, and for social film-nights for our club members and potential new members. Here's a list of single DVDs we have (last two were donated) and looking forward to delving into the various topics. We will select one to watch at our Membership Social on February 28th. *See you at Karen's!*

"Exceptional - America's Keys to Greatness" by David Barton, WallBuilders (60 min) America truly is a blessed nation. In so many important categories, she represents the exception rather than the rule among the nations of the world. Our exceptionalism encompasses great diversity of race, ethnicity, and religion, and has benefited every American. But today, American Exceptionalism is no longer understood or venerated. Following several decades of indoctrination in both education and politics, many Americans now seem ashamed of their country and feel compelled to apologize to others for it. We have been taught America's flaws but little of its matchless benefits. What produced the blessings we take for granted that so many other nations only dream of? The answer is found in five principles set forth in the Declaration of Independence. Discover these principles and learn what every citizen can do to restore America's greatness.

"Four Centuries of Education" by David Barton, WallBuilders

Excellent presentation explaining the foundation of education was based on religion; the founders promoted education for all (public education started in 1650); the Northwest Ordinance provided that "religion, morality and knowledge are the foundation of education." Barton concludes that the more secular based the education is, the poorer education becomes. Religion, morality and knowledge are the basis of character development and essential for the survival of a republic form of government like ours.

"Politics: Easy as PIE" (**P**olitics = **I**ntegrity + **E**conomics) by Bob McEwen, WallBuilders (60 min) A good, basic explanation of how wealth is created; capitalism is contrasted with socialism; the Declaration of Independence and God's influence on the Declaration of Independence and the Constitution is discussed. He has a very straightforward and easy to understand interrelationship between freedom and wealth as well as the opposite circumstance with the twin conditions of greater government and less freedom and greater poverty. He provides examples of what limited government looks like and what changes are needed to have/keep limited government.

"A Nation Adrift" by Timothy Barton, WallBuilders (62 min)

America has long been a beacon of freedom, stability, and prosperity. But recent generations no longer understand the foundations upon which America was built. As a consequence, there is now a visible erosion of the unique principles that produced the success we long enjoyed. How do we recover and restore what is now being lost?

"Fire From the Heartland: The Awakening of the Conservative Woman" (2010; 84 min) The first-ever film to tell the entire story of the **conservative woman** in her own words, a powerful statement about America at a crossroads and the women who have awakened to the crisis.

"America: Imagine the World without Her" by Dinesh D'Souza (2014; 85 min) A follow-up to his film *2016: Obama's America*. D'Souza contends that parts of United States history are improperly and negatively highlighted by liberals, which he seeks to counter with positive highlights.

We also purchased these DVD sets: **Constitution Alive** (12 week series), **Foundations of Freedom Series** (18 episodes/30 min. each), **American Heritage Series** (26 episodes/30 min. each), and **Building on the American Heritage Series** (13 episodes/30 min. each). ■
