
Many are looking to get involved, to be more proactive, and to make a difference!!



~ Propaganda/Fake News vs. Just the Facts (Part One) ~

The vaccines are currently being used on an "emergency" basis and are not FDA approved. They use a new technology, something called a "spike protein" instead of the traditional (attenuated antigen) response of a traditional vaccine. The long-term health implications of

having this spike protein for years in the human body and human brain are unknown, therefore do your own research. **Susan's** favorite resource is, <u>America's Frontline Doctors</u>, a wealth of info, their <u>White Paper on Experimental Vaccines for Covid-19</u>, and <u>protecting your rights</u>. The biggest myth regarding COVID-19 is this is a highly lethal infection. *It is not*. The data is unequivocal, *as shown in the chart on the right*: <u>COVID-19 kills</u> very rarely and is mostly limited to the medically fragile.

There are growing health concerns regarding wearing masks, both for adults and children, with government and business mandates still "requiring" you to do so. Each of us should be "allowed" to make that choice, just like with the vaccine. **Our advice**: *If you don't want to wear a mask, then don't.* Many places still have "Mask Required" signs, yet say nothing when you enter without one. From <u>The New England Journal of Medicine</u>, April 1, 2020:

"It is also clear that masks serve symbolic roles. Masks are not only tools, they are also talismans that may help increase health care workers' perceived sense of safety, wellbeing, and trust in their hospitals. Although such reactions may not be strictly logical, we are all subject to fear and anxiety, especially during times of crisis. One might argue that fear and anxiety are better countered with data and education than with a marginally beneficial mask, particularly in light of the worldwide mask shortage, but it is difficult to get clinicians to hear this message in the heat of the current crisis. Expanded masking protocols' greatest contribution may be to reduce the transmission of anxiety, over and above whatever role they may play in reducing transmission of Covid-19."

"Masks do not prevent virus respiratory illness. Size matters! Viruses are 50x smaller than bacteria and 1000x smaller than a hair."

Review of Scientific Reports of Harms Caused by Face Masks, up to February 2021, by Denis G. Rancourt, PhD in summary: "It is a testimony to the power of propaganda, institutional capture, and the desire to socially conform that masking of the general population has successfully been imposed during the COVID-19 era. The harms from this imposition are palpable, and potentially long-term and gargantuan, not the least of which is the psychological training of the public to comply with an absurd measure that has direct personal negative impact. I review the mounting evidence of the obvious: Universal masking harms people and society, without any detectable benefit."
