We were kept on our toes with a very dynamic message from our speaker, **Jessie Jane Duff**, who came all the way from Sacramento, CA.

KFRW primary and associate members who are veterans that we honored during the evening were: **Janis Morrow, Tom Amburgey, John Haynes, Mac McNeill, David Miner**, and **Harry Mulhearn**. We remembered and honored the 13 U.S. service members killed in Afghanistan on August 26, 2021, eleven Marines, one Navy corpsman, and one Army special operations soldier, with a picture and brief bio of each on a special table in front.
