

The new Pop-Up tent we purchased (\$257) was a huge asset for those of us putting it up and taking it down, although it would be rather cumbersome if ONE person (as they say) had to put it up alone. The tent came with four optional zip-up sides so we zipped her up tight on Friday night and prayed all would still be there on Saturday morning, weather-wise and undisturbed, and it was!

Foot traffic was a little less than last year, most likely due to the 100° temps both days and located on the asphalt made it even hotter. We made \$966 from merchandise sales and \$3 donations ("keep the change"). In all, we sold: 15 Bumper Stickers, 15 Magnets, 9 Buttons, 14 Flags, 3 Trump Shot Glasses, 3 Fanny Packs, 13 Caps, 4 Hats, 10 Cowboy



Hats, 9 Jewelry items, and the last 2nd Amendment License Plate. The website has been updated removing items no longer available and noting SOLD OUT for items we most likely will reorder.



WF Parade: Members represented KFRW in the WF Parade, which thankfully was overcast. Want to thank all those who helped decorate, rode on the float and kept walkers supplied with give-a-ways (Robin Frutig, Diana Osietski, & Dotty McPherson), and the walkers (Annaliese Mincy & Andrew Kang carried the banner) Karen Knox, Gretchen Wallace, Janis Morrow, Betsy Upchurch, Brenda Kiff, and Chuck Mincy, who provided the truck and trailer, and drove "slow" during the parade. They gave away 804 items: 150 tri-color beads, 288 patriotic pencils, 240 "God Bless America" buttons, and 126 small USA flags. Whew!
