

#### ~ Election Integrity Going Forward, But Not Forgetting 2020 ~

Rasmussen Reports Field Guide to Election Integrity July 7, 2022 - All U.S. National Likely Voters -

- 50%\* of All Voters believe widespread cheating will affect the outcome of the Nov 2022 elections inc 36% of Dems, 43% of Independents, 71% of GOP & 46% of Black voters.
- Between 52%-59%\* a clear majority of American voters and tested multiple times maintain that cheating likely affected the outcome of the 2020 national elections.
- 55% of Black voters said there was cheating in the 2020 elections.
- 55% support 2020 election audits including 53% of Black voters.
- 58%\* say wider use of mail-in voting will lead to more cheating in elections, including 57% of Black voters.
- 59%\* say preventing cheating more important than making it easier to vote.
- 60% agree that opponents of requiring a Photo ID to vote just want to make it easy to cheat in elections, including 63% of Black voters.
- 61% agree "Election Reform must happen in Swing States like PA, MI, GA, WI, & AZ where voters have lost confidence in their electoral process."
- 66% say requiring Photo ID for voting isn't discriminatory, inc 57% of Black voters.
- 70% say private 'Zuckerbucks' type partisan election funding is "a bad thing for American Democracy," including 52% of Black voters and 62% of Democrats.
- 75% say they are concerned about preventing election cheating, including 53% who are Very Concerned. 75% of Black voters are concerned about preventing election cheating.
- 75% of Black voters either believe the level of difficulty to vote is currently about right or believe it is already too easy to vote.
- 79% say requiring Photo ID to vote is a reasonable measure to protect the integrity of elections, including 78% of Black voters.
- 82% including 82% of Black voters say the issue of Election Integrity will be important this November including 61% saying it will be Very Important.
- 90% think it is Important to prevent cheating in elections, including 83% who say it's Very Important. This includes 87% of Black voters who say it is Important to prevent cheating in elections, including 77% who say it is Very Important.
