If you are also one of the KFRW officers, note the KFRW Executive Committee Meetings on the 2nd Wednesday of each month. Later this month, we will publish the 2023 KFRW Calendar with other important dates for you to note in your calendar well before they are to take place.

Why is this beginning of the year task so important?

Or, missed an important KFRW event, like the Watermelon Festival or our Biennial Veterans Dinner, because you'd scheduled an out-of-town trip.
