Legislative – Permit-less carry went into effect in Florida July 1 with the following provisions:

21 years or older can legally purchase & own a firearm; can legally carry it concealed without a concealed weapons permit. Any law-abiding citizen in the US can legally conceal carry a firearm (handgun, not a long gun) in Florida without any permit, but must carry a valid form of ID (driver's license or state ID card) with you if you carry a handgun concealed.

So-called gun free zones are still enforced. You cannot carry on school property, a polling place, federal property, US Post office, National Park Service, Police, Sheriff, Highway Patrol or any government meeting (Legislature, School Board, County Commission, City Council, etc.)

HISTORY OF KEYSTONE FEDERATED REPUBLICAN WOMEN

The **Keystone Federated Republican Women** (KFRW), formed on July 26, 2018 with 16 charter (primary/voting) members. Here's what led up to that historic day five years ago...

I attended my first ever JC Republican Party meeting on June 19, 2018. **Beth and Dale Young**, up from Melbourne for the week, attended too. Prior to the start of the meeting, **Dotty McPherson**, who was, and still is, the Region 2 District Representative for the FFRW, made an announcement asking if there was any interest in Monticello of forming a women's club. Later, I got her number.

The next day I called Beth, we met and discussed what was involved. I called **Karen Knox**, the only local woman I knew to call, who was on board from the start. On July 4, Karen and I sent an email and flyer to some we knew who might be interested and invited them to one of two informational meetings, Friday morning July 13 and July 17 after the July REC meeting. **Colin Barton**, the REC Chair at that time, was very supportive of our initiative and sent our email to the JC republican party email list. Here's the first part of my email.

"I've never been interested in being politically involved, but since the 2016 election I've felt more and more led to do something in my space...to help expose others to the facts in order to make informed decisions. Just like in the food industry, there is so much deception circulating constantly in the political arena and that can be frustrating. This is my motivation for being more intentional here in Monticello.

We are forming our own Florida Federation of Republican Women's club in Jefferson County and will have two meetings in July to provide information about the organization and how to become a member and get involved, to the extent you want, to make a difference in our community, state and nation. Membership in the club is open to all women who are registered Republicans and men can also join as associate members."

From those who attended or replied to one of our emails, we set a meeting for Thursday, July 26 at my home to begin the process. Interestingly, we had four charter members who changed their party affiliation from DEM to REP to join. An email received earlier that day, "*Can't come tonight, but I'm now a registered Republican.*" And another changed from NPA to REP as well.

That evening, we chose our club's name (we considered: *Jefferson Federated Republican Women and Aucilla River Area Federated Republican Women*), agreed on the annual membership dues (\$30 for new members, \$25 for renewals), we all wrote two checks, one to FFRW and one to KFRW, decided on our meeting day and time (still the 4th Monday at 7pm), and adopted our initial club bylaws. We also had 4 associate members, who are all still with us, one now a primary member.

The next day, an EIN number from the IRS and a Non-Profit Articles of Incorporation was obtained. On July 31, our New Club Application was completed and submitted to the Florida FRW, along with our bylaws, list of 16 members and FFRW dues checks. August 3rd, we opened our bank account at F&M Bank with \$445. On August 13, 2018, our club application was approved by the National Federation of Republican Women and we were chartered, receiving it at the FFRW Fall Conference in Orlando, Sept. 21-23, 2019, attended by me and Karen Knox.

At the start of 2019, we had 30 primary and 12 Associate members. **Today**, we have 51 primary and 22 associate members.
