

#### NFRW 2023 BIENNIAL CONVENTION OVERVIEW

The **National Federation of Republican Women** (NFRW) celebrated 85 years at their <u>42<sup>nd</sup> Biennial</u> <u>Convention in Oklahoma City, OK, Sept. 28 - Oct. 1, 2023</u>, with nearly 1,200 registrants, including 692 delegates, and members attending from 42 States and new clubs from Washington, D.C. and the U.S. Territory of Puerto Rico. NFRW clubs "live" the Credo: *Educate, Motivate, Activate!* NATIONWIDE, during the past 2 years the NFRW has chartered 137 NEW clubs!

Based on the total political and campaign volunteer hours and phone calls submitted by all the clubs throughout the NFRW, here are the totals: **VOLUNTEER HOURS** = 14,531,606 and **PHONE CALLS** = 5,718,987. <u>Note</u>: **Florida** was 1 of 6 states making the top numbers of "Phone Calls", and was the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd-Place Quarterly Winner (States with 30-49 clubs) for "Volunteer Hours". The NFRW calculates the <u>total dollar value</u> of all the calls and hours equates to \$435,948,180!!

The **FFRW**, one of 25 states, earned the top National award—the "**Betty Heitman Award for State Excellence**" in these areas: Membership Development, Campaign Activities, Programs, Community Service, and State Function. **21 FFRW clubs**, including **Keystone FRW**, won the top CLUB Achievement Award—the "Diamond Award" for those same areas.

**Florida** (the FFRW) was the NATIONWIDE 1st Place Trophy Winner for "**Public Relations**", which involves improving visibility and attracting coverage of federation activities. And, also top winner of the "**Armed Services Award**" in supporting members of the United States Armed Services.

**Our Keystone Club**, was a Regional Finalist of the "**Caring for America Award**" for its Community Service and Outreach in the Medium Club category. Only one other Florida club was a finalist, WRC of Naples Federated (MEGA Club category). Great job to **Gretchen Wallace** for her projects!!

#### From page 1: Results to the survey questions asked of average people on the street in the USA:

1.	<i>What percentage of the country is black?</i> <b>**</b> If you watch commercials, you would think it is 90%.	<b>Answers</b> : 41% <b>Actual</b> 13%
2.	What percentage is "Latino"?	<b>Answers</b> : 39% <b>Actual</b> 17%
3.	What percentage of marriages are mixed race?**	<b>Answers</b> : 50% <b>Actual</b> 1%
4.	What percent of Americans are vegetarians?	<b>Answers</b> : 30% <b>Actual</b> 5%
5.	What percentage of Americans are "transgender"?	<b>Answers</b> : 22% <b>Actual</b> .5% (POINT 5)
6.	What percent of Americans live in New York City?	<b>Answers</b> : 30% <b>Actual</b> 3%
7.	<i>How many families make more than \$500,000 a year?</i> We think a quarter of the country is rich.	<b>Answers</b> : 26% <b>Actual</b> 1%
